Then, students rotated through four themed activities including art, sports, history, and hymns. The day also marked the start of the Reformation Research Paper competition. Over the next few weeks, students will conduct research and prepare projects about what they would seek to reform in their society.

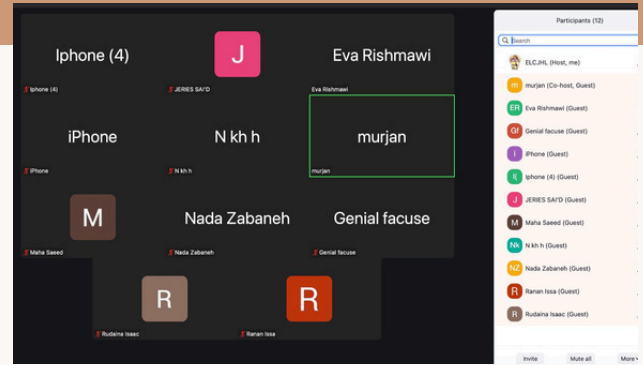

Old City Tour with Youth Ministry

In collaboration with the ELCJHL Youth Ministry, the Gender Justice Ministry organized a tour of the Old City of Jerusalem for youth from the Jerusalem congregation with help from youth leaders. Despite living in Jerusalem, many of these youth have limited experience exploring their own holy sites due to safety concerns around accessing the Old City.

Israeli settler and police violence makes it difficult for Palestinian youth to easily and safely access parts of their own city. This tour gave youth the opportunity to learn more about their home and holy places. In a time when many Palestinian youth are leaving the Holy Land, the church hopes to deepen the connection youth have to their land through learning the history of the city and country. These activities also seek to build deeper ties between youth and get them more involved in the church. The tour was led by Jerusalem congregation member Salim Mussalam.



Breast Cancer Awareness Virtual Workshop

The Gender Justice Ministry held an interactive virtual workshop for women of the ELCJHL to raise awareness about breast cancer screening and preparedness in recognition of October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month. The workshop was led by Nurse Murjan Abed from Augusta Victoria Hospital and focused on the importance of early detection, screening methods, and correcting common misconceptions about mammograms. Nurse Murjan explained how modern screening is very safe and effective. We want to thank the women who shared their personal experiences stories around breast cancer.





Fall Bird Week

The EEC held the 26th Bird Week this month. The EEC hosts Bird Week every spring and fall to celebrate the bi-annual journey of migrating bird species through Palestine.



Bird ringing, tracking, and study is a crucial part of the EEC's work that contributes to research and conservation efforts in the region. Bird week's activities included birding tours, education about bird tracking, and environmental advocacy.
